



# MAKE YOUR OWN MOONWALKERS FIZZY BATH PLANETS!

## INGREDIENTS

-  1 cup baking soda
-  1/2 cup cornstarch
-  1/2 cup epsom salts
-  4 tablespoons cream of tartar

-  2 tablespoons coconut oil (melted) - you can replace with vegetable oil if desired
-  3-4 teaspoons water
-  Food colouring
-  A round mould (from any craft store)

## METHOD

1. In one bowl, mix together the dry ingredients.
2. In another bowl, mix together the wet ingredients.
3. Slowly mix together the wet and dry ingredients.
4. Whisk together all ingredients until the mixture forms a crumbly texture. It should be fairly dry but just wet enough to hold its shape when moulded together.
5. Fill your mould with mixture, patting down after each addition scoop or spoonful of mixture to make sure it's tightly packed throughout the mould. It has to be really tightly packed or it will fall apart when you remove it from the mould. (May need adult help with this step!)
6. Gently squeeze the mould to remove the fizzy bath planet.
7. Allow to sit and dry overnight on a towel.
8. Enjoy your Moonwalkers fizzy bath planet in the bath! NOTE: You can also add in essential oils if you would like to add scent to your fizzy planet. If you choose so, add in with wet ingredients in step 2.


